PASSION SUNDAY


Today we celebrate the 5th Sunday of Lent which was once known as Passion Sunday. This is the beginning of the final 2 weeks of Lent and the build up to our Easter celebrations.

An excerpt from today's gospel is Wherever I am, my servant will be there too (In 12:27). Pope Francis reminds us that when we choose to follow Christ we choose to walk with him through 'thick and thin', in good times and bad. It is to travel with him all the way to the Cross.

Today's Gospel invites us to turn our gaze to the Crucifix which can be seen as an ornamental object or a clothing accessory. More importantly, it is a religious symbol to contemplate and to understand. Within the image of Jesus crucified is revealed the mystery of the death of the Son as a supreme act of love, the source of life and salvation for humanity of all ages. We have been healed in his wounds.

May the Virgin Mary who, from the manger in Bethlehem to the Cross on Calvary, has always kept her heart's gaze fixed on her Son, help us to meet and know him just as he desires so that we may live enlightened by Him and bring to the world fruits of justice and peace.



Income & Expenditure Summary

YTD Total Income is \$24,058 higher than the corresponding period last year, due to: a.collection Income is \$8,363 higher this year,

- b. distributions received from the EA O'Connor Trust are \$2,664 higher this year, (mainly used to fund the painting of the Wakefield church earlier this year)
- c. other income is \$16,880 higher this year and includes:
- i) increased investment income as a result of higher term deposit interest rates
 ii) recovery of costs to reseal the Motueka carpark

YTD Total Expenses are \$85,401 higher than the corresponding period last year, mainly because of:

- a.repairs & maintenance which has had a high expenditure mainly due to the painting of the Wakefield church and resealing of the Motueka carpark.
 b.with two priests, we have higher travel & vehicle expenses,
- c.with higher collection income, we have a corresponding increase in ADW levies,
- d. we have higher inflationary costs such as insurance and electricity.




