## A PLACE TO REST AND PRAY

In today's gospel Jesus describes a large crowd who had followed him and gathered around him in the hope of hearing all he had to say. He felt sorry for them, referring to them as 'sheep without a shepherd', and so he continued to teach them many things, despite his need for rest and space.

Stories like this one in Jesus' ministry reassure us that God never turns any of us away. Jesus is modelling to the apostles the extent of their ministry to others. They too are shepherds of the flock, feeding and protecting the people, reassuring them of Jesus' continued presence through word and deed. Jesus is also modelling to us, his followers, how to serve. We must be ready and available to "feed the hungry, spread the Gospel to those who are without hope; and care for those who search and hunger for God".

Today's message also cautions that good shepherds, as with all leaders, need to find some rest and quiet, and take time to get away from the hustle and bustle of the crowds and from busy lives. All ministries need to be balanced with "care for the care-givers". Hence the ever-comforting words of today's Psalm:

#### PSALM 23

The Lord is my Shepherd; there is nothing I shall want You let me rest in fields of green grass.

You lead me to streams of peaceful water, and you refresh my life. You are true to your name, and you lead me along the right paths. I may walk through valleys as dark as death, but I won't be afraid. You are with me, and your shepherd's rod and your staff make me feel safe.

Your kindness and love will always be with me, every day of my life, And I will live forever in your house, O Lord.

The parish incurred a net operating deficit for the three month period ended 30 June 2024 of \$7,216 (slightly smaller than the deficit for the same period last year of \$12,587).

Total Income and Total Expenses are both higher last year as this included the cost of painting of the church in Wakefield of \$46,000 and part recovery of that cost from the EA O'Connor Trust.
