Through the ritual meal of the Last Supper, Jesus points to a future event, his crucifixion, in which his body will be broken and his blood shed. In the Eucharist we remember Christ's saving action and participate in its fruits



Why does Jesus give himself to us as food and drink?

Jesus gives himself to us in the Eucharist as spiritual nourishment because he loves us. By eating the Body and drinking the Blood of Christ in the Eucharist, we become united to the person of Christ through his humanity. "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him" (Jn 6:56). In being united to the humanity of Christ, we are at the same time united to his divinity. Our mortal and corruptible natures are transformed by being joined to the source of life. (USCCB)

The feast of Corpus Christi is celebrated to heighten our awareness of the gift of the Eucharist. Every Mass is a participation in and celebration of the sacrifice of Christ. When we process toward the altar to receive Communion, in reality it is Christ who comes toward us to assimilate us in him. Receiving the Eucharist means letting oneself be transformed by what is received. "We become what we receive." Pope Francis.

The movie 'Cabrini' is showing in Takaka over the next week.

"this true life tale of an audacious young Italian woman who came to New York with nothing, to fight for the equality, health and happiness of immigrant orphans" and is about Francesca Cabrini (1850-1917) who founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and, in 1946, became the first canonised saint in USA. She is also the Patron Saint of Immigrants - still so relevant in our time.

"Renowned as a woman of great faith, Mother Cabrini was also a shrewd businesswoman. Over the course of 34 years she established an astonishing 67 hospitals, orphanages, and schools. Her energy was fueled by an intense focus on serving Jesus in whatever he asked of her". It has good reviews and is uplifting - as well as a bit gritty at times.
